

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### Liquor Service Licence

# Unique Hospitality Venue

## Gaming Centre

Licensees are responsible to comply with all general liquor service terms and conditions; terms and conditions specific to the type of licence held; and any terms and conditions specific to the premises.

### 8.0 Gaming Centre Specific

#### 8.1

The licensee is authorized to sell liquor for consumption in the licensed premises as long as the premises continues to operate as a gaming centre.

#### 8.2

Unless otherwise authorized by the LGCA, liquor must not be sold or served in the gaming centre:

- a) 2:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. daily; and
- b) from 2:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. on Remembrance Day.

#### 8.3

A minor is permitted to enter the licensed premises but is not permitted to enter the gaming area for the purposes of participating in provincial casino gaming.

#### 8.4

Except as authorized in 8.5, the licensee must not:

- a) give, sell or otherwise supply liquor to a minor;
- b) allow a minor to possess or consume liquor in the licensed premises.

#### 8.5

The licensee must ensure a minor does not possess or consume liquor in the licensed premises unless:

- a) the liquor is purchased or provided by their adult parent, spouse, common-law partner or guardian; and
- b) the liquor is consumed with a meal in the presence of the minor's adult parent, spouse, common-law partner or guardian.

#### 8.6

The licensee must ensure that only age-appropriate advertisements and entertainment are permitted in areas where minors have access to the premises.

#### 8.7

The licensee must ensure that there is a variety of food items available to patrons in the licensed premises at all when liquor is served.

#### 8.8

The licensee that allows a patron to bring their own wine for service with a meal held at a private function must ensure that:

- a) the wine is commercially-made and in an unopened bottle;
- b) the wine is for consumption with a meal served in the premises;
- c) the wine brought by the patron into the licensed premises is not sold at the private function;
- d) the private function is held in an area reserved for the exclusive use of the patron and their guests; and
- e) the licensee complies with the Act respecting the service, consumption and handling of liquor in the licensed premises as if the wine had been purchased in the licensed premises.
