The Liquor, Gaming and Cannabis Authority of Manitoba (LGCA) regulates the province's liquor, gaming and cannabis industries, including oversight for liquor sales, service and manufacturing; gaming employees, products, events and operations; and retail cannabis stores. The LGCA is also in the process of integrating the regulatory responsibilities of the Manitoba Horse Racing Commission into its mandate. We strive to serve the public interest by regulating these industries in a respectful, impartial and balanced manner.

The LGCA is seeking a highly motivated individual to work within the Gaming Integrity Department, which is part of the Operations Unit.

Qualifications:

The successful candidate must have:

- A post-secondary diploma in electronics, computer science, information systems or a gaming related field.
- 5 -10 years work experience in the gaming industry particularly in the areas of lottery schemes, gaming accounting and game protection. An equivalent combination of education and work experience may be considered.
- Strong inspection and investigation skills including planning, execution and preservation of evidence.
- Knowledge and experience interpreting and applying policies, procedures, legislation and supporting regulatory standards and requirements.
- The ability to analyze, solve problems and make decisions related to complex and highly technical lottery schemes and issues, and develop technical standards, quality assurance testing and game protection procedures.
- Strong oral and written communication and interpersonal skills to manage conflicts and to build strong working relationships with diverse clients and stakeholders.
- Effective critical thinking, research skills and sound judgement to evaluate and analyze applications and provide recommendations that may be broad in scope, with limited opportunity for standardized solutions.
- Strong organizational skills with the ability to plan, balance and manage multiple work demands to effectively meet competing deadlines.
- Demonstrated political acumen when dealing with confidential and sensitive information.
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and in a team environment.
- Proficiency in the use of computer applications including Microsoft Office, Team Viewer, GOTO meeting, and program verification utilities.

The following qualifications are desired:

- Experience with a Regulatory Management System (RMS) or other speciality computer programs.
- Proficiency in French.

Your cover letter and résumé must clearly indicate how you meet the qualifications.

Duties:

The role of the Gaming Integrity Specialist is to provide reasonable assurance to the government and the general public that all new and existing lottery schemes* in the Province of Manitoba meet LGCA standards of gaming integrity and control, in accordance with the Liquor Gaming and Cannabis Control Act, terms and conditions and general regulatory standards. The incumbent supports the enforcement of LGCA regulations and policies, as well as other legislative requirements.

*Lottery Schemes include but are not limited to: Electronic Gaming Devices (EGDs), Video Lottery Terminals, Gaming Central (Networked) Systems, raffles, games of chance, table games, bingo, break open tickets, lotteries and all associated hardware and software that may impact the integrity of the gaming environment.



Additional Information:

- An eligibility list may be created for similar positions and will remain in effect for 12 months.
- Circumstances may arise where the competition may need to be withdrawn.
- Applicants may be required to write a screening/selection test.
- Must be legally entitled to work in Canada.
- A positive attendance record will be a consideration in the screening process.
- Satisfactory work performance in the preceding 12 months is required.
- A satisfactory Criminal Records Check and Drivers Abstract must be produced and maintained.
- A valid Manitoba's driver's licence, access to a vehicle and ability to travel periodically throughout Manitoba are required.
- Must qualify under *The Liquor, Gaming and Cannabis Control Act* to be appointed as an Inspector.
- Occasional lifting or shifting of objects weighing up to 75 kilograms.
- Ability to occasionally work irregular hours on evenings and weekends.

The LGCA has a comprehensive compensation and benefits package which includes extended health care, health spending account, dental care, vision care, long term disability insurance, group life insurance, maternity leave top-up plan, family related leave and a defined benefit pension plan (some pension plans allow for portability between the Civil Service Superannuation Board and employers). The LGCA also has ergonomic workstations and free parking. Training, educational support and career development opportunities are also available.
