

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Horse Racing Participant Licence

Jockey

Licensees must comply with all general racing participant licence terms and conditions, and terms and conditions specific to the type of racing participant licence held.

3.0 Jockey

3.1

The licensee may be tested for alcohol and/or drugs. Testing may occur:

- a) at regularly scheduled intervals;
- b) based on random selection; and
- c) if there are reasonable grounds to suspect that the licensee may be impaired or intoxicated.

3.2

The licensee must not own, train, or assist in training any race horse.

3.3

The licensee can be represented by only one jockey agent at any given time.

3.4

If the licensee is represented by a jockey agent, the jockey agent must make all engagements to ride for the licensee.

3.5

The licensee may make their own engagements to ride only if they are not represented by a jockey agent.

3.6

The licensee must fulfill all engagements in respect to racing, and the licensee is bound by the commitments made by their agents.

3.7

The licensee must not make a bet on any race, or accept a promise or token of any bet, with respect to the race in which they are riding, except through or from the owner or trainer of the horse they ride, and only on that horse to win.

3.8

The licensee must not ride in a race against a horse that is owned in whole or in part by:

- a) the spouse of the jockey; or
- b) a child younger than 18 years of age, where the jockey is the child's legal guardian or parent, or lives in the same household as the child.

Apprentice Jockeys

3.9

An apprentice jockey certificate may be issued to a jockey who meets the following criteria:

- a) is younger than 25 years of age, and
- b) has previously never been licensed as a jockey.

3.10

Apprentice jockey certificates are valid to a maximum of three years or once the apprentice has won 45 races.

3.11

Apprentice jockeys are given allowances as described in the rules of racing.

4.0 Recordkeeping

4.1

If the licensee is not represented by a jockey agent, the licensee must retain records respecting all engagements to ride made by the licensee, including:

- a) the date of the race;
- b) the race for which the engagement is made; and
- c) first or second call, whenever more than one is given for any jockey in any race.
